

One new cruiser that's ready to go before Christmas

WARR'S Harley-Davidson has just completed this heavily-tweaked Cross Bones Softail 'Deco Bobber' – part of the Warr's Bobber series.

At £19,995 the stunning new machine is far from cheap but if you were to

build the bike yourself it would set you back around £23,000 for all of the individual parts, paint and labour.

The Deco Bobber is based on a brand-new 2009 FLSTB Cross Bones Softail.

It features a unique art deco-style paintscheme by Keith Baker, blacked-out chrome hillclimber handlebars and lamps, half moon floor boards, retro mirrors, blacked rims, brown leather detachable saddlebags –

which lock to the bike – and a matching solo seat.

The exhaust system is finished in matt black and uses two-into-one fishtail end caps. Performance wise you get a stage one remap.
